The two verses say the same thing in two ways – Hebrew parallelism
- 9) What will happen to those who trust in Jesus? (v.11)
- 10) Why is there no difference between Jew and Gentile? (vs. 12 – 13)
Who will be saved?
- 11) What human argument does Paul put forward that the Israelites weren't saved? (vs. 14 – 15)

- 12) Did all Israelites accept the good news? (v.16)
- 13) Where does faith come from to be saved? (v.17)
What is the word of Christ?
- 14) Was the argument that the Israelites didn't hear the Gospel true? (v.18)
What quotation does Paul use to back up his answer?
- 15) What nation was Paul referring to in verse 19?
What would God make that nation do to Israel, and why?
- 16) Who did God reveal himself to and who was he found by? (v.20)
- 17) What was God's attitude to Israel, and what was Israel's attitude towards God? (v.21)
