- 5) Are all of the descendants of Abraham his children? Through whom are the offspring of Abraham? (7) Genesis 21: 8 13
- 6) Who aren't and are the children of God? (v.8) What is meant by "the children of the flesh"? What is meant by "the children of the promise"?

- 12) What did God say to Moses? (v.15) Why did Paul quote this?
- 13) What does our salvation not depend on and what does it depend on? (v.16)
- 14) Why did God raise Pharaoh up? (v.17)
- 15) What do we learn from verse 18?
- 16) What is the human argument against God's mercy and hardening of hearts? (v.19)
- 17) What is the answer to the human argument? (v.20) Two rhetorical questions

- 18) What analogy does Paul use in verse 21?
- 19) How does God show his wrath and his power known? (v.22) Who are vessels of wrath?

Did they become vessels of wrath or were they prepared by God to be vessels of wrath?

20) Why does he do that? (v.23) Who are his vessels of mercy? When did he prepare them?

- 21) Where do his vessels of mercy come from? (v.24)

  Did they choose to be vessels of mercy or were they called to be vessels of mercy?
- 22) Did God have a people? (v.25 26)
  Who were not his people that he will call his people?
  How will he treat his people whom he calls?
  What will his beloved be called?
